Clean Cities Coordinators—A Natural Resource for Federal Fleet Managers

Recently, the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) Clean Cities program held its annual training for the 87 Clean Cities coalitions throughout the country. During this training, Clean Cities coordinators were asked to discuss strategies on how

they can better help Federal fleets in their coalitions. Based on their feedback, many coordinators noted an inability to locate and engage local Federal fleet managers, especially those with a significant number of Energy Policy Act (EPAct) Section 701 waivers.

DOE's Federal Energy Management Program (FEMP) recommends that Federal fleet managers get to know the local Clean Cities coordinators in their regions. Clean Cities coordinators have proven to be an invaluable resource for Federal fleet managers, helping them find solutions to alternative fuel availability and bringing valuable stakeholders to the table to help fleet managers overcome the barriers to meeting their alternative fuel use and petroleum reduction mandates. Federal fleet managers and coordinators can work together to address the goals and strategies listed in the Comprehensive Federal Fleet Management Handbook (www.femp.energy.gov/pdfs/eo13514_fleethandbook.pdf) and Guidance for Federal Agencies on E.O. 13514 Section 12, Federal Fleet Management (www.femp.energy.gov/pdfs/fleetguidance_13514.pdf).

Success Story: Aloha Delivers First Supply of E85 in Hawaii

At the end of October 2010, Aloha Petroleum Ltd. delivered the state's first supply of E85 ethanol fuel. The fuel was delivered to Marine Corps Base (MCB) Hawaii for use in more than 70 of its flex-fuel vehicles. While E85 has been available on the mainland since the early 1990s, this is the first time the fuel has been made available on a commercial scale in Hawaii. Aloha Petroleum has supplied fuels to the military through the Defense Energy Support Center contract for a decade. With the E85 contract, Aloha Petroleum will help MCB Hawaii achieve its alternative fuel use goals.

"Last week's delivery is a significant milestone for the state of Hawaii and Aloha Petroleum," said Richard Parry, Aloha Petroleum president and CEO. "We've been working with the U.S. Department of Defense for the last three years on various alternative fuel projects. We believe that the new E85 station at Marine Corps Base Hawaii will help pave the way for wider use of E85 in the Islands."

Greenhouse Gas Concentrations

The White House Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) has released Guidance on Federal Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Accounting and Reporting that establishes government-wide requirements for measuring and reporting GHG emissions associated with Federal agency operations. The Guidance serves as the Federal Government's official GHG Protocol and will be used by Federal agencies to develop their first GHG inventories. Stations accept Wright Express and Voyager fleet payment cards unless otherwise noted. Electric charging stations are included to prepare agencies for incorporating electric vehicles into fleets; fleet payment card acceptance is unknown for these stations.
